## A Webinar for the Archdiocese of San Francisco on the New Directory for Catechesis

## Hosted by the Office of Faith Formation Archdocese of San Francisco

Following the Spirit of the Catechetical Directories of 1971 and 1997, the newly published 2020 text invites the Church to re-evaluate, reconsider, and renew how we present the unchanging truths of our faith to our communities. As the Vatican's document which guides how the Catechism should be taught, it asks us to examine the extent to which Evangelization animates not only our teaching methods, but more I mportantly, the extent to which the living Christ, as revealed in Scripture, is at the center of who we are, how we pray as a family and local community, how sensitive we are to those at the margins, as well as how responsive we are to the pressing needs of our world-

#### Presenter: Fr. Phillip Alcon Ganir, S.J.



Born in Seattle and raised in Honolulu, Fr. Phillip Alcon Ganir, S.J. joined the US West Province of the Jesuits in 1999 after graduating from the University of Hawaii at Mānoa in Political Science and Asian Studies. In addition to the spiritual, pastoral, and academic training required of Jesuits, he completed music degrees at the Manhattan School of Music and the University of Notre Dame, and worked as an Associate Pastor at St. Ignatius Parish, Sacramento. Currently a PhD Candidate in Catechetics at the Catholic University of America, he is writing his dissertation on the intersection of music and catechesis by exploring the catechetical potential of the repertoire of Scottish composer, Sir James MacMillan.







### Course on the Eucharist

Beginning new year, the online SPM will be hosting a course on the Eucharist. I believe that it is an excellent course and I encourage all of you to sign for it. I also ask the Catholic School Religion Teachers to also sign up for this information course and it will help them in explaining the Mystery of the Eucharist to their students.

The Eucharist is, like so many aspects of our faith, a great mystery. But to call something a mystery in the theological sense is not to say that we cannot understand anything about it. Instead, it is to say that we can never learn *everything* about it. A theological mystery is not unintelligible; it is infinitely intelligible. In other words, even though we can never fully comprehend it, can never just put it in a box and move on, we can always learn more about a theological mystery.

In our course together we will look at the multifaceted mystery of the Eucharist through several lenses. We'll use Bishop Barron's wonderful little book, titled simply *Eucharist*, as well as some of my own writings to look at themes like meal, sacrifice, real presence, transubstantiation, Christian Unity, and liturgy. Here's a little sampler.

- The Eucharist is a meal, but a unique kind of meal. The Eucharist is a sacrifice, but a unique kind of sacrifice. And meal and sacrifice, far from being opposing ideas, inform one another. It is the essence of every meal that something dies so that others might live.
- In the Eucharist Christ is *really* present, but not in a way that our contemporary categories materialist, on the one hand, or purely subjective, on the other can make much sense of. What does the Church mean by calling Christ's Eucharistic presence "real"? And how does that shape how we understand *reality* more generally?
- Catholics believe in transubstantiation. What exactly does this mean? And what *doesn't* it mean? Is transubstantiation compatible with the ways in which other Christians think about Christ's Eucharistic presence? Is agreement about the Eucharist possible for Catholics and other Christians?
- Humans are formed by practices. How does our celebration of the Eucharist form and inform us? Can we learn to recognize
  how other cultural practices cultural liturgies, even seek to form and inform us? In what ways does our liturgy, the Mass,
  counter that formation?

These are some of the questions that will guide our discussion, but please bring your own questions as well. I love Q & A and will leave time for it at the end of each session. If you want to learn more about this central mystery of our Catholic faith, register today and invite a friend.

#### **Simbang Gabi Commissioning Mass**

Each year, the Archdiocese of San Francisco holds a Mass with Commissioning Rites to herald the beginning of the "Simbang Gabi Masses" widely celebrated in various parishes throughout the Archdiocese, in the days leading up to Christmas. "Simbang Gabi" is a centuries-old Filipino Catholic faith practice dating back to the 1600's. With the country's agricultural roots, the practice traditionally began as a novena of pre-dawn masses, but more recently, has been

adapted to evening celebrations.

We encourage you to attend our Simbang Gabi Commissioning Mass. Bring your own Filipino Christmas "Parol", and your family "Creche" (or Nativity scene) to receive a special blessing during the Mass. Please verify the dates and times of Simbang Gabi Masses that may be celebrated at your parish of choice.

This month, the global Catholic Church began a synod process that will culminate in 2023 with the

Synod of Bishops. The Synod on Synodality is a two-year process of listening and dialogue beginning with a solemn opening in Rome on October 9 and 10, 2021 with each individual diocese and church celebrating the following week on October 17. The synodal process will conclude in 2023.

Pope Francis invites the entire Church to reflect on a theme that is decisive for its life and mission: "It is precisely this path of synodality which God expects of the Church of the third millennium." This journey, which follows in the wake of the Church's "renewal" proposed by the Second Vatican Council, is both a gift and a task: by journeying together and reflecting together on the journey that has been made, the Church will be able to learn through Her experience which processes can help Her to live communion, to achieve participation, to open Herself to mission.


Leadership Roundtable to partner with U.S. Bishops, Vatican leaders to promote Synod.

#### A Christmas message of Simplicity and **Tenderness**



Al contemplar la esencia de la Navidad, nos fijamos en el pesebre y la cuna para la inspiración en medio de tantas realidades duras que nos enfrentamos hoy en día. Algunos de ustedes tal vez no quieran contemplar el rostro de la humanidad sufriente, pero eso es precisamente lo que hace que la Navidad sea tan especial. El sufrimiento nos pone en contacto con nuestra condición humana vulnerable y la conciencia profunda de que Jesús asumió esta naturaleza nuestra para traernos paz y gozo, consuelo y amor. El Papa Francis dice:

> "En la sencillez del pesebre encontramos y contemplamos la ternura de Dios, manifestada en el Niño Jesús."

Contemplando este Dios-hecho-carne, nuestros corazones se inspiran por la belleza y la simplicidad del establo y nos invitan a "mirar, considerar, contemplar, para que pueda imitar," en las palabras de Santa Clara de Asís. San Francisco fue e corazón y inspiración de reproducir en vivo el nacimiento de Jesús. El invita al pueblo de Asís a formar parte del primer pesebre navideño que simulaba para que todo el mundo pudiera ser movido por el "amor que nos ha amado".

As we contemplate the essence of Christmas, we look to the stable and crib for inspiration in the midst of so many harsh realities we are faced with today. Some of you might not want to contemplate the face of suffering humanity, but that is what precisely makes Christmas so special. Suffering puts us in touch with our vulnerable, human condition and the profound awareness that Jesus assumed this nature of ours to bring us peace and joy, comfort and love. Pope Francis says,

> "In the simplicity of the crib we find and contemplate the Tenderness of God manifested in the Child Jesus."

Contemplating this God-made-flesh, our hearts are warmed by the beauty and simplicity of this setting of the stable and we are invited to "gaze, consider, contemplate, so that you might imitate," in the words of St. Claire of Assisi. St. Francis went to the heart of the matter when he invited the people of Assisi to be part of the first Christmas stable that he simulated so that everyone could be moved by the "Love that has loved us."
