Each one of you have made a big difference in sowing the seeds of faith with our children, adolescences, adults, and families. This is truly what Pope Francis talks about as the voca-

tion of the catechist. Your willingness to join with the Office of Faith Formation in the Archdiocese has been a joy. Collaboratively we provide the best faith formation for everyone.

Remember that formation of ourselves and our catechists is vital to a program steeped in the long tradition of our church. Plan now to

- Send your catechists to formation
- Come to formation yourself
- Provide on-going formation throughout the year

Laypeople who feel called to the ministry of catechists should be actively involved in the life of their Catholic communities and faithful to the Gospel and the teaching of the church, says Pope Francis. But they also must receive "suitable biblical, theological, pastoral and pedagogical formation to be competent communicators of the truth of the faith."

"Catechists are called first to be expert in the pastoral service of transmitting the faith as it develops through its different stages from the initial proclamation" of the Gospel, preparation for receiving the sacraments and support in living a Christian life.

The Role of Faith Formation

The new 2020 <u>Directory for Catechesis</u> handles the issue by describing the bishop as the "one primarily responsible for catechesis in the diocese" and the one who "has the principal function . . . of promoting catechesis and providing the different forms of catechesis necessary for the faithful" (§114). Parents, on the other hand, "with their example of daily life, have the most effective capacity to transmit the beauty of the Christian faith to their children" and should avoid the "mentality of delegation that is so common" in which formation is reserved for "specialists in religious education" (§124).

We can never forget to involve parents in the faith formation of their children but this does not take away the important role of the parish in providing well trained catechists to work with our various catechetical programs. All families have the right by Canon Law to have religious education for their children. In the Archdiocese of San Francisco no child can be turned away from formation.



Catechetical Sunday, a national day to celebrate the ministry of passing on the faith, will be **September 18, 2022**.

This year's theme is:

This is my body given for you / Esto es Mi cuerpo que se entrega por ustedes

With these words from the Gospel (Luke 22:19), the Lord Jesus offers us the gift of himself in the Eucharist. This theme reminds us that the object of all catechesis is Jesus himself. The role of the Catechist is, first of all, to be a disciple and one who draws close to Jesus in the Eucharist, and then to be a witness to others and a companion as they too come to know Jesus and to encounter him in the sacraments. May we who aspire to be effective catechists, have unwavering faith in the real presence of Christ, that we lead others by teaching and example to encounter Jesus with us at the Eucharistic table.

Commissioning of Catechists

We encourage using Catechetical Sunday to publicly commission and pray for those who will serve as catechists and teachers in the parish community. A commissioning rite is available for use at Sunday Masses or in a special prayer service:

Catechetical Sunday also offers an opportunity to recall that all the Baptized have roles in handing on the faith in their daily life, families, work, and church involvement. Some parishes include a rededication of all parishioners to catechesis in addition to the commissioning of those called to the particular ministry of catechist.



As the *Directory for Catechesis* teaches, "The faith is professed, celebrated, expressed, and lived above all in community" (DC 88). Because the deepening of trust in God is fundamental to lifelong formation, the individual participating in faith formation must also be able to trust the community, mentors and instructors accompanying their spiritual growth. This means that they must feel welcomed and accepted, able to express doubts and confusion as they grow in faith. To accompany people on a journey of lifelong formation we must invite and welcome them into a community of faith, where they can experience the love of God more fully over time. This includes meeting them with continued patience and love, respecting each person's unique gifts, pace, and calling during their journey with Christ.
