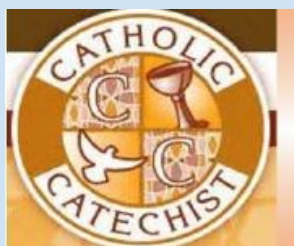

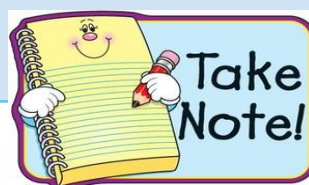

Check out all of the wonderful opportunities this summer for catechist formation. Information is in this newsletter.

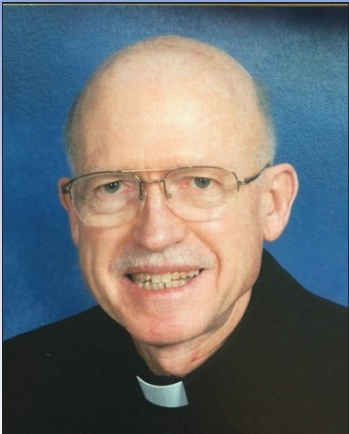

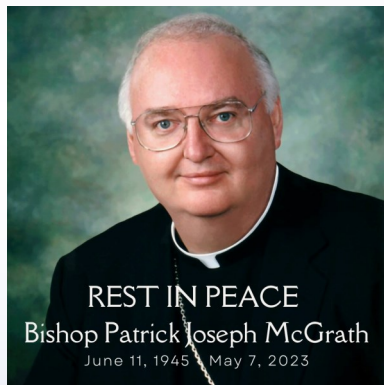

Fr. Kieran McCormick

Fr. Kieran McCormick died peacefully yesterday evening at Aegis Living in San Francisco after years of declining health. He was born on June 17, 1938. He was ordained to the priesthood for the Archdiocese of San Francisco by Archbishop Joseph McGucken in 1964, more than 58 years ago at Saint Mary's Cathedral.

He now joins his brother, Fr. Mickey, in heaven. Both have given so much to our archdiocese. Blessings!



May 7, 2023

Bishop PJ McGrath

Bishop McGrath was born June 11, 1945 in Dublin, Ireland. He entered St. John Seminary, Waterford, Ireland in 1964 and was ordained to the priesthood in Waterford June 7, 1970 for the Archdiocese of San Francisco.

In 1977 he earned his doctorate in canon law at the Pontifical Lateran University in Rome. In 1979, Bishop McGrath became Officialis of the Archdiocese of San Francisco and was appointed Rector and Pastor of Saint Mary Cathedral in 1986. Ordained Auxiliary Bishop of San Francisco on January 25, 1989, he then served the Archdiocese as Vicar for Clergy, Moderator of the Curia and Vicar for Parishes.

On June 30, 1998 he was named by Pope John Paul II to be Co-adjutor to the Bishop of the Diocese of San Jose and was formally received into the diocese at a Mass of Welcome on September 17, 1998. Upon the retirement of Bishop Pierre DuMaine on November 27, 1999, Bishop Patrick Joseph McGrath became the second bishop of San José. Bishop PJ was loved by so many who knew him and the Diocese was blessed by his ministry as our bishop for 20 years (1999-2019)

The theme is "Talitha Koum" from the Gospel of Mark: 5:41. It is the story of Jesus rising the little girl who has died. The wordings spoken by Jesus is "Little Girl Get Up (Arise)

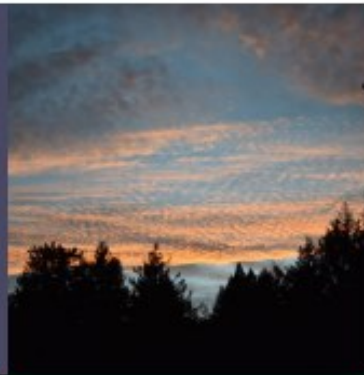

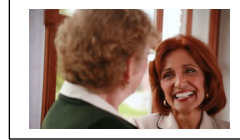

How Do We Recruit New Catechists? INVITE Them!

What is it that all DREs know about the majority of Catholic families today? They are overwhelmed by an overbooked schedule of events and work, and growing our faith is often deferred to those once-in-a-while. So how do we find future catechists? I propose we **INVITE** people to consider the call to be a catechist.

I = INITIATE a conversation.

- Regular parent gatherings or intergenerational events bring together parents or families who are willing to answer an invitation.
- The parents who drop off their children give us an opportunity to have conversations about the faith formation program and the faith formation of their family.
- Begin by sharing about the child's response to faith formation sessions.
- Share how other parents became involved.

N = NOTICE who lingers and seems curious about the happenings at faith formation sessions.

Thinking of Becoming a Catechist? is a great page to share with prospective volunteers. It includes reasons to become a catechist, the Catechists in Action video series, and Joe Paprocki's popular webinars.

V = VALUE the time and the conversation shared. Listen for anything that sounds like:

- I wish I knew more about my faith.
- The children's book is quite interesting.
- Do you have anything that I could use with my other, smaller children?

I = INVITE these parents to help, even if it is just one time.

- Helping in the child's group gives a taste of how catechesis is done and allows the parent to see that it is not scary but enjoyable when the tools are provided.
- If parents offer to assist in the office, have them come in to help some day to stuff envelopes or collate papers. This offers an opportunity to talk with them about becoming a catechist.

T = THANK everyone involved with the program:

- The parent, grandparent, aunt, uncle, or whomever drops off the children; that adult is ensuring the children come to sessions.
- Children for coming and sharing about Jesus. Children will share these kindnesses with their families.
- Catechists—in front of children and parents. Constant support for these volunteers makes the role inviting to others.

E = ENCOURAGE everyone who enters into the catechetical space to:

- Be a part of their child's faith life.
- Participate in weekend Mass so children understand better what they are learning about their faith.
- Learn so much more about their own faith by joining the catechetical journey with the children of the parish.

May your efforts at catechist recruitment be fruitful! What methods do you use to invite parishioners to consider becoming a catechist?

Are you familiar with TeenSTAR? It's a curriculum, developed by a Catholic nun (who is an OB/GYN) to teach young men and women about sexuality, from a physical/ spiritual / psychological/ social/ intellectual point of view. It has 3 levels (MS age, or HS or YA)... it is taught in over 50 countries worldwide and now enjoying a renaissance in the US. The curriculum is available in both English and Spanish.

It can be taught by parents, catechists, school teachers, etc. We will have a live teacher training Aug 5/6 in SF. We will offer a Zoom presentation on TeenSTAR with Molly Daley, J.D., who was previously in the San Francisco archdiocese and a popular visiting speaker at St. Patrick's Seminary. She has worked with Deacon Santiago Molina, the Executive Director of TeenSTAR, and in public schools with TeenSTAR on the East Coast. Molly is articulate, personable, and seasoned.



Our Lady of Mount Carmel Director of Faith Formation

Our Lady of Mount Carmel Church, Mill Valley, California, is seeking to interview candidates for the full-time position of Director of Faith Formation.

We have begun preliminary exploration of the New Evangelization and the experience of Whole Parish Faith Formation, and we are excited and committed to implement this program in our parish. We are looking for someone to work with the pastor and music director to develop programs and processes that will deepen the faith life and commitment of our parishioners, and it is our belief that many are ready for this.

While Religious Education programs have historically focused on teaching religion to parish children, we believe it is essential to provide spiritual nourishment to parents as well, so that children have nurturing environments for their faith at home. Through the grace of their baptism, adults are, by definition, in an ongoing encounter with Jesus Christ, an encounter that is nourished through the celebration of the Eucharist and other Sacraments. A robust Faith Formation program will encourage parents to participate more frequently in the Mass and engage more fully as active members of the parish family.

The Director of Faith Formation (DFF) will collaborate with the Pastor and shall be responsible for the faith formation for children and their families in grades Kindergarten on, including sacramental preparation to be carried out according to the catechetical norms of the Archdiocese of San Francisco (including RCIC), catechist recruitment, training and support, and parent outreach. The DFF will also contribute to forming Faith Formation experiences geared to the parish at large, in which context, in collaboration with the Pastor, they will develop processes of Sacramental Preparation for Matrimony, Baptism, and RCIA.

Minimum Qualifications

Candidates wishing to apply for this position should have the following qualifications:

- practicing and active Catholic in good standing;
- BA in Theology/Religious Education or a related theological field;
- three to five years of experience working as a DFF or in parish ministry;
- proficiency in computer programs (Word, Excel, Power Point, etc),
- an understanding of and willingness to engage actively in social media.

The Archdiocese of San Francisco will only employ those who are legally authorized to work in the United States for this opening. Any offer of employment is conditioned upon the successful completion of a background investigation. The Archdiocese of San Francisco will consider for employment qualified applicants with criminal histories. We are an [Equal Opportunity Employer](#). La Santa Trinidad.

CIC 232 - 237

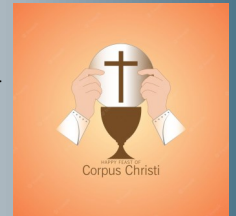
El Dogma de la Santísima Trinidad es fundamental en nuestra fe, es el misterio de un solo Dios en tres personas, el primero en usar este término fue Teófilo de Antioquia en el año 170, la Iglesia lo celebra el siguiente domingo después de Pentecostés.

El misterio es en ocasiones difícil de explicar o entender ya que este va más allá de solo la razón por si misma, es necesario entenderlo con la fe que se nos dio en nuestro bautismo.

CIC 237. La Trinidad es un misterio de fe en sentido estricto, uno de los misterios escondidos de Dios, "que no pueden ser conocidos si no sin revelados desde lo alto" (Concilio Vaticano I: DS 3015). Pero la intimidad de su Ser como Trinidad Santa constituye un misterio inaccesible a la sola razón e incluso a la fe de Israel antes de la Encarnación del Hijo de Dios y el envío del Espíritu Santo.

Corpus Christi

Corpus Christi es la fiesta del Cuerpo y Sangre de Cristo que se lleva a cabo el jueves después del domingo de la solemnidad de La Santísima Trinidad, en algunos lugares esta fiesta es trasladada al domingo siguiente.

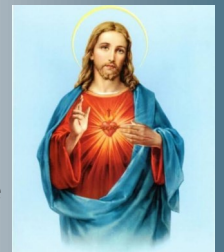


En esta fiesta se instituyó en el año de 1364 gracias a Santa Juliana de Lieja (Santa Juliana de Mont Cornillon) quien desde muy joven tuvo una gran veneración al Santísimo Sacramento.

En esta solemne celebración recordamos también la institución de La Eucaristía que se llevó a cabo el jueves antes de la pasión de nuestro Señor Jesucristo.

Sagrado Corazón de Jesús.

Esta Solemnidad se celebra el viernes de la siguiente semana después de Corpus Christi, gracias a Santa María Margarita Alacoque a quien en junio de 1675 en una experiencia mística Jesús le Reveló "Te pido que el primer viernes después de la octava de Corpus [Christi] se celebre una fiesta especial para honrar mi Corazón que se comulgue dicho día para pedirle perdón y reparar los ultrajes por El recibidos"



Así pues en la Iglesia Católica esta fiesta es una fiesta de asociación a la reparación de nuestras faltas en contra de Jesús.
